

Green chosen for chairman at RSPA

Penny Green, chief executive of SAUL Trustee Company, has taken over as chairman of Raising Standards of Pension Administration (RSPA).

Green has been involved in the organisation since its inception in January 2002. The objective of the voluntary initiative is the advancement of knowledge and learning in respect of pensions administration.
